- LD600 An Act to Achieve Mental Health Parity in Workers' Compensation
 - Changes standard of proof required for mental injuries
 - Mental injuries as preexisting conditions



- LD758 An Act to Clarify Work Search Requirements for Workers' Compensation
 - Shifts burden to employer in cases where employee seeks 100% partial incapacity benefits



- LD947 An Act to Extend the Notice Period in the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992
 - Increase notice period from 30 to 180 days



- LD1204 An Act to Eliminate the Cap on Weekly Benefits in Workers' Compensation Cases
 - Elimination of maximum weekly benefit cap



- LD1203 An Act To Clarify the Retirement Presumption under the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992
 - Loosens retirement presumption



- LD1205 An Act to Allow Full Retirement Benefits under the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992
 - Eliminates offsets for retirement benefits
 - Prohibits recovery by employers for overpayments



- LD1253 An Act to Fairly Compensate for Fatal Accidents under the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992
 - Eliminates 500-week cap on benefits



- LD601 An Act to Create Fairness by Reinstituting Cost-of-living Adjustment for Workers' Compensation Benefits
- LD809 An Act to Expand and Clarify the Disqualification from Workers' Compensation Benefits of an Employee Who is Injured While Under the Influence of Drugs or Alcohol
- LD1501 An Act To Change the Law Governing Occupational Disease Claims under the Maine Workers' Compensation Act of 1992



Other National Issues

- CA: apportionment due to non-industrial genetic factors
- IN: new narcotics legislation
- KS: permanent impairment standards
- NJ: prohibits voluntary payments of permanent disability benefits
- NH: optional reimbursement of medical marijuana
